A RESOLUTION OF THE COTTAGE CITY COMMISSION AUTHORIZING THE

HIRING OF COUNSEL

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 57 of the Town Charter, the Town has the power to

employ such legal consultants as it deems necessary from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has been advised of the opioid crisis facing communities in

Maryland like Cottage City; and

WHEREAS, the Town Attorney has been in contact with Jeff Reeves, Esq. of the law firm

of Theodora Oringher along with its associated firms who specialize in cases against pharmaceutical

companies that manufacture the opioids that have found their way into communities like Cottage

City; and

WHEREAS, the Attorney Reeves, his firm and its associates have agreed to represent the

Town of Cottage City in State court pursuant to the Retainer Agreement annexed hereto; and

WHEREAS, Attorney Reeves and the referenced firms have agreed to represent the Town

at no cost unless there is a recovery won.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Cottage City Commission, to hire the

firms of Shaprio Sher Guinot & Sandler, P.A., pursuant to the Maryland Rules of Professional

Conduct, and Theodra Oringher P.C., and Andrews and Thornton, pursuant to the California

Rules of Professional Conduct, on a contingent fee basis, to pursue all civil remedies against the

manufacturers of prescription opiates and those in the chain of distribution of prescription

opiates responsible for the opioid epidemic that is plaguing Cottage City, and other communities

including but not limited to filing a claim for public nuisance to abate, enjoin, recover and

prevent the damages caused thereby.
